Instructions for Completing the International Student Financial Aid Application

The International Student Financial Aid Application is designed to gather information from international students who are applying for financial aid at colleges and universities in the United States. When completing the application, it is important to:

- answer all questions that apply to you and your family,
- convert all currency figures to U.S. \$ before entering them on the form,
- return the form directly to the college that provided or requested it. Do not send it to the College Board.

Some of the questions on the International Student Financial Aid Application are self-explanatory; the instructions that follow are only provided for questions that may need further explanation.

Section A - Student's Information

This section pertains to the student who is applying for aid.

Section B - Parents' Information

- 14. Write in the number of people who live in your parents' household and are supported by their income.
- 15. Complete all parts of this question. Include family members counted as your dependents in question 10 and/or counted as your parents' dependents in question 14.

Section C - Financial Information

- Give the official exchange rate at the time you complete the application.
- 19. Please indicate your source of money for your transportation costs to the United States.
- 20. Write in the amount of previous year's income taxes or expenses from each of the sources listed.

Section D - Asset Information

Asset information pertains to the parents or to the student and the student's family if the student is married and lives independently of the parents.

- 23. Write in the value of assets at the time you complete this application.
- 26. Most colleges require you to submit documentation to verify information on this form. Check with the college to determine its requirements.

Section E - Expenses

27. Write in the annual amount your family spent on the items listed. If you do not know the specific amount, please estimate.
